TRIBUTES

TIN TÁN, THE FIRST MEXICAN OF THE XXI CENTURY

The 2008 edition of the Festival renders tribute to the Mexican actor Germán Valdés, the legendary Tin Tán, who will be the *leit motiv* during the Festival.

Tin Tán conferred life to the Mexican social imaginary. Valdéz's musical talent, improv acting and discipline for work made him one of the most memorable and treasured comedians of Mexican films.

On Saturday 8 at the Galería Chapultepec the exhibition *Tin Tán en fotos* will be opened. The artist's family photographic archive and posters of some of his films will be displayed. The film *El rey del barrio* (1949), by Gilberto Martínez Solares, will be screened at 8:00 pm.

On Wednesday 12 the book *Las películas de Tin Tán*, by Emilio García Riera, published by the Cineteca Nacional in collaboration with the Guadalajara International Film Festival, will be presented by the writer José María Pérez Gay and the Spanish critic and past director of the San Sebastian Film Festival Diego Galan.

GUADALAJARA AWARD GUSTAVO SANTAOLALLA

Argentinean musician Gustavo Santaolalla will receive the Guadalajara Award in recognition to his international celebrated professional career as an artist.

As composer, musician and producer Santaolalla has fostered a successful and productive relation with the film industry. Two consecutive Oscar awards in 2005 and 2006 for his work in the music of *Brokeback Mountain*, by Ang Lee (for which he also received a Golden Globe) and *Babel*, by Alejandro González Iñárritu (receiving his second Bafta award). With González Iñárritu, he also did 21 grams and Amores perros.

The cinema owes him grand moments that Santaolalla had offered to Argentinean rock fans. From the creation of the group Arco iris in 1969 up to his most recent activity with the band Bajofondo Tango Club, including his work as producer with Café Tacvba, Maldita Vecindad, Molotov, Juanes, and Julieta

Venegas. His moniker of *The Guru* within the music industry confirms his ability to turn good projects into impressive works.

His career as composer in the film industry also includes *Motorcycle diaries*, by Walter Salles, with who Santaolalla is also working in his most current venture *On the road*. His work will be present in the Festival's opening ceremony with the documentary *El café de los maestros*, by Miguel Kohan.

SILVER MAYAHUEL BERTHA NAVARRO

Bertha Navarro is one of the most dazzling and determined producers of the Mexican film industry and will be honored with the Silver Mayahuel for her work and commitment to Ibero-American films.

She was born in Mexico City, and from her early stages as assistant director in the 70's, she has established a zeal for films and the Latin-American soul. At the age of 25, she produced the documentary *Reed, México insurgente*, by Paul Leduc.

In 1996, she was the director of the XI Festival (previously known as Muestra de Cine Mexicano en Guadalajara) and encouraged its renovation into a festival with the involvement of producers and distributors. Since 1993, she coordinates the screenwriters' laboratory of Latin-America sponsored by the Sundance Film Institute and the Carmen Toscano Foundation. She is also associated of the producing company Tequila Gang and Estudios Picasso.

In her search for innovative talents, she has shared her early beginnings with directors like Paul Leduc, Nicolas Echevería (*Cabeza de vaca*, 1991), Guillermo del Toro (*Cronos*, 1993), Carlos Carrera (*Un embrujo*, 1998), Sebastián Cordero (*Crónicas*, 2004), and Andrea Martínez (*Cosas insignificantes*, 2008). Currently she is working with the latest projects of Guillermo del Toro and Alfonso Cuaron. Navarro has been involved in international co-productions like *Men with guns*, by John Sayles (1997), and last year's success *Pan's labyrinth*, by Guillermo del Toro, with whom she has developed one of the most innovative film groups in Mexico.

INTERNATIONAL FILM HOMAGE FERNANDO BIRRI

Renowned for his films, poems, theoretical essays and paintings, Birri is part of the indispensable list of Latin-American cinema, since 1960, with the presentation of his medium length documentary *Tire dié* and his manifesto *Por un cine nacional realista, crítico y popular*.

Fernando Birri was born in 1925 and is considered by many the patriarch of Latin-American cinema. He was founder in 1956 of the legendary Argentinean Escuela Documental de Santa Fé. Between 1950-1953, he studied at the Centro Sperimentale di Cinematografía and co-founded the Escuela Internacional de Cine y TV de San Antonio de los Baños, Cuba, which directed in between 1986-1991.

He has received numerous awards which include the Juries First Critic award, at the Mar del Plata International Festival in Argentina (1959) for *Tire dié*; the Juries First Special award at the Karlovy Vary International Film Festival in Checoslovaquia (1962) for *Los inundados*; and in 1985 the Quijote award from the International Federation of Filmclubs at the Festival del Nuevo Cine Latinoamericano, La Havana, for *Mi hijo el Che, un retrato de familia de don Ernesto Guevara.*

FERNANDO PINO SOLANAS

Fernando *Pino* Solanas is a steadfast filmmaker concerning the social and political reality of Argentina, for over half a century through the havoc of the 70's with surreptitious shootings he presented his first work *La hora de los hornos* (1968), until his most recent work *Argentina latente* (2007), which presents the productive and technical capacities of his fellow citizens.

Between both films he lived in exile in Spain and France (1976-1983) evicted by the military dictatorship that wanted to stop him. He has produced five fiction films always framed under unusual economic, social and political circumstances

and four documentaries that are true pictures of the Argentina at the end of the XX century and beginning of the XXI century.

His professional career has been recognized with the Golden Bear at the Berlinale, and he is an authorized voice of contemporary Argentinean history.

LITA STANTIC

To appreciate the development of current Argentinean cinema Lita Stantic is fundamental. Producer, director, and screenplayer. 1965 is the kick off of her career by directing shorts like *El bombero está triste y llora* y *Un día...* and works as director assistance in the film *Diario de un campamento*, by Pablo Szir.

During the 70's, she begins her first productions and activism with Cine Liberación, convinced that films and art may well construct a better world.

In 1993, she writes and directs the feature film *Un muro de silencio* based on the account of those years. She was awarded the Glauber Rocha by the foreign press at the La Havana Festival and the Human Rights award at the Brazilian Florianopolis Festival.

Her work is crucial to understand the so called new Argentinean cinema. Between 1986 and 2001, she was president of the Argentinean Chamber of Film Industry.

Her work is present in representative films like *Mundo grúa*, by Pablo Trapero, *La ciénaga*, directed by Lucrecia Martel, or *Un oso rojo*, by Adrián Caetano. After 35 years of production Stantic is a reference for any young Argentinean young filmmaker with a project in hands.

Meeting of authorities, producers, and distributors from Argentina and Mexico

On Tuesday March 11, sessions will take place to analyze and foster collaboration between both film industries.

This event is organized by the Instituto Nacional de Cine y Artes Audiovisuales from Argentina (INCAA), the Instituto Mexicano de Cinematografía (IMCINE), and the Guadalajara International Film Festival, with the objective to boost bilateral cinematographic relations. Producers with experience in Argentinean-Mexican co-productions and producers interested in such opportunities will attend this forum.

These will be close door meetings, and participants will address institutional polices of each country that foster collaboration. Current trends of each country's cinematography will be presented and compared as well as sponsorship programs and the possibility of cooperation frames to foster Coproductions between Mexico and Argentina, and distribution experiences will also be shared.

75 years of Sonofilms

Towards 1930, the Argentinean cinematography initiates one of its most brilliant episodes reinforce by the surge of sound in films in which tango plays a key role in them.

In 1931, entrepreneur Carlos Mentasti funds Argentina Sonofilms that along with Luminton are the first enterprises to develop integrated film studios emulating the North American business and organization trends.

These companies were responsible of the highlights of the Argentinean films in the Latin American market (the so called golden era of Argentinean cinema) and had an undeniable impact in the dissemination of Tango in the region.

The 450 accredited participants for this edition will have an integrated video library with the latest production in Ibero-America which includes 576 titles, and will be installed in a business center equipped for buyers' activities and needs.

Guadalajara Film Market & Producers Network. The sales of film rights, the participation in international festivals, co-production and film finance will be some of the themes that will be discussed for two days March 9 and 10. Six simultaneous breakfast work meetings will take place for registered producer at the 6th Ibero-American Film Market.

Also in collaboration with Marché du Film of the Cannes Festival, the second edition of Producers Network will have sessions with a special guest per table to dialogue over broad issues of the film world. This space opens a window of

knowledge and exchange of ideas among professionals that are interested in the cinematographic spectrum of Ibero-America. 56 participants have been registered.

The moderators for this event will be: Sheila de la Varende (National Film Board, Canada), Julie Bergeron (Producers Network Manager, France), Jan Miller (Strategic Partners, Canada), Alfredo Calviño (CEO Latinofusion, Mexico), Hugo Villa (director of Film Production Support of IMCINE, Mexico) and the renowned sales agent Christa Saredi from Switzerland.

Also key distributors, producers and sales agents will be present as special guests.

Distributors with Vision. In an effort to gather a representative group of experts from the field of film commercialization the Ibero-American Film Market has drawn together in its recent editions conferences with leading distribution enterprises. For this 6th Market in Guadalajara the program will include:

<u>Distribution and exhibition of digital cinema</u>. Five North American, Spain, and Brazil enterprises will offer a global program of digital distribution of these activities organized under the program of Digital Space.

La Central Digital (Spain), Interdocnet (Spain), Moviemobz (Brazil), Renew Media (USA), and Whithoutabox (USA).

<u>Distribution of Mexican Films in Mexico.</u> Five professionals will offer their vision regarding distribution strategies for Mexican films.

Buena Vista Columbia Tristar Films de México, Canana, Corazón Films, Gussi, and Mantarraya Producciones.

Made in Mexico. 17 Mexican films of recent production will make up the Made in Mexico section. These exclusive functions will be screened for the participants of the industry. In its third consecutive year this section will foster the commercialization of national films in foreign countries.

IV Ibero-American Cinematographic Co-production Meeting

25 fiction and documentary projects in their development stage will be offered for international financing film funds including aid initiatives for production and distribution.

The highlight of this year's edition is that 28 documentary projects were received due to last year's high demand to open this genre, and 110 future fiction films were registered, a considerable increase compared to last year's edition. This

states the significance that this venture has for the development of Ibero-American projects.

This year selected projects which will also contest for the *Iberoamerican Films Crossing Borders*, a workshop organized by the Fundación Autor and the Instituto Buñuel of the SGAE (Spain) in this XXIII edition of the Guadalajara International Film Festival. Its aim is to offer tools so films may move through international markets in particular the European.

Also this will be the second year that the **Premio Televisión Española de Adquisición de Derechos de Antena** will be awarded.

This award provides the acquisition of Antenna rights for one of the participating projects for a minimum amount of €150,000 (and up to €250,000, depending on the importance of the project).

Iberoamerican Films Crossing Borders 2008. Meetings among audiovisual professionals with the aim of fostering the distribution of Ibero-American productions overseas especially in Europe.

On March 6-7, the 25 selected works for the IV Ibero-American Cinematographic Co-production Meeting will be included in a series of lectures, work groups, and interviews with the contribution of renowned personalities of the film industry. This extraordinary occasion is sponsored by the Spanish organizations of the Sociedad General de Autores y Editores (SGAE) and the Instituto Luis Buñuel.

Some of the professors that will teach the course are Manuel Gutiérrez Aragón, screenwriter, director, and president of the Instituto Buñuel; Gerardo Herrero, president of Tornasol Films, Spain; Antonio Saura, director of the Cinema Department of Zebra Productions, Spain; Claudia Landsberger, executive director of Holland Films, Holland, and president of the European Film Promotion; Renate Roginas, director of the program team PHARE of the European Union; John Durie, co-founder of Strategic Film Marketing, United Kingdom; Lucy Virgen, director of the Guadalajara International Film Festival Program; and Alexander Joos, lawyer in the USA.

This first edition will follow its European antecedents (in Berlin and San Sebastian) and provide a magnificent setting for these selected projects to acquire information of prominent professionals in the field and increase their skills regarding financing, production, and promotion of their products within international markets.

World Cinema Fund. The WCF is the foremost cinematographic financial fund in the world, with an annual budget of €500,000 Euros. It aims to help the realization of films which otherwise could not be produced. WCF focuses on the

production and distribution of projects from Africa, Latin America, Asia, and Middle East. *Luz silenciosa*, by Carlos Reygadas, is one of the many successful WCF funded projects. This film will be analyzed in a working session in the IV Ibero-American Co-production Meeting and *Visionary Campus* Guadalajara. The Festival will also screen three films that were supported by the WCF: *Faro, le reine des eaux*, by Salif Traoré. Mali, 2007; *A perfect day*, by Joana Hadjithomas and Khalil Joreige (Lebanon, 2005); and *Recycle*, by Mahmoud al Massad (Jordanian, 2007).

The WCF materializes in this Festival in hand with the Berlinale, the *Kulturstiftung des Bundes* (German Culture Federal Foundation) and the Goethe Institute.

Guadalajara Construye

What started in the XXII edition of the Festival as Films in Progress Toulouse-Guadalajara will now be offered as **Guadalajara Construye**. This new program will sustain its fundamental nature: promote the completion of six post-production fiction feature films from Mexico, Central America, and the Caribbean (including Colombia). Under its new name **Guadalajara Construye** will contribute with 220,000 US dollars to distribute among selected films due to the generous involvement of national and international industries that along with the Festival are committed in supporting films in these regions.

JURIES

IBERO-AMERICAN FICTION FEATURE FILM

JORGE CÁMARA. Journalist, director, screenwriter. República Dominicana.

Since his beginnings, he has worked on television enterprises like Televisa Network, Telemundo, and Univision. For cable television, he has worked for Cine Canal's, HBO OLE and promotion for 20TH Century Fox. Camara directed, co-produced, and wrote the documentaries *Gladiador: Lo mejor y lo peor del boxeo* (Columbia Pictures); *Dune: Hecho en México* (Universal Pictures), and *Scar Face: La participación latina* (Universal Pictures).

He is a film critic and writes for the journal *La Opinión* (Los Angeles); for the magazines *Caras* and *Cine Premiere*; as a Hollywood correspondent, for the magazines *Caras* and *Cine Premiere* (Mexico); for the Dominican publications *Pandora* and *El Caribe*; and for the journal *Diario Litin*.

In 1993, he received the Publicists Guild of America International Media Award as recognition to his excellent film and television coverage, and the Southern California Motion Picture Council Bronze Halo Award, for his contribution to the entertainment industry. He is the president of the Hollywood Foreign Press Association's Golden Globe Awards, and a member since 1968.

PIERRE HERNI DELEAU. Producer, director. France

Founder of a number of French film festivals which today belong to the major events in the international festival calendar. He collaborated in the founding of the Director's Fortnight at Cannes in 1969 and was its General Delegate for 30 years, until 1998. He is co-founder of the FIPA (Festival International des Programmes Audiovisuels) of which he has been General Delegate since 1987, and the Strasbourg European Film Forum that he managed from 1996 to 2001. Pierre-Henri Deleau also worked as a publisher for cinema books, for example the collection Cinéma & Litérature by Edition Jean-Claude Lattès. He has been a member of the EFA Board since 1998, and participated as an international jury in several festivals around the world including Venecia, Valencia, Cartagena, Biarritz, Chicago, among others.

JORGE FONS. Director. Mexico

Born in 1939 in Veracruz, Fons graduated at the Centro Universitario de Estudios Cinematográficos (CUEC) of the UNAM in 1966. The legendary film independent producer Marte accepted a proposal by Fons, Tito Novaro, and Manuel Michel to make their début with the film *Trampas de amor* (1968),

divided into three episodes (*El dilemma, Yvonne,* and *La sorpresa*, the latter directed by Fons). Fons' second industry work and his first feature film was *El quelite* (1969). His following films were an episode of the series *Tú, yo, nosotros* (1970) and the film *Los cachorros* (1971), which was an adaptation from a brief story by Mario Vargas Llosa and applauded by the critic and audience. As an independent producer, Fons directed *Rojo amanecer* (1989) and *The alley of miracles* (1995). Throughout his career, he has filmed a number of shorts.

MIGUEL LITTIN. Director. Chile

This Chilean film director had to leave his country in 1973 due to coup d'état and the establishment of Augusto Pinochet's dictatorship. In 1985, he concealed his returned to his country to shoot an audacious film project about the political facts of his country, *Acta general de Chile*. Littin finished this film in Spanish and Gabriel García Márquez turned this story into book.

Littin studied theatre at the University of Chile and worked as television director for the university's channel. In 1969, he started his cinema career with the film *El chacal de Nahueltoro*. In 1971, he was appointed manager of Chile Films. During the Unidad Popular, along with his executive activities, Littin filmed some documentaries and the feature film *La tierra prometida*. He directed *Sandino* (1991) and *Los náufragos* (1994). In 2000, with *Tierra de fuego* Littin took once more the epopee popular style.

MARYSE SISTACH. Director. Mexico

She studied Social Anthropology at the University Paris-Sorbonne. In Mexico, Sistach studied in the Centro de Capacitación Cinematográfica (CCC), forming part of a prolific generation of women directors. Her thesis work, the short ¿Y si platicamos de agosto? (1980), obtained the Ariel award. Her first feature film Los pasos de Ana, an independent film, participated at the Berlin Festival and launched her as an intimate filmmaker trait that she confirmed in her second film Anoche soñé contigo. Throughout the last nine years, Sistach has directed the films La línea paterna (1995), El cometa (1999), Perfume de violetas (2001), La niña de piedra (2006), and El brassier de Emma (2007). She has been jury at the Guanajuato and Chicago festivals.

MEXICAN FICTION FEATURE FILM

LUPE ONTIVEROS. Actress, producer. USA

Actress, producer, and social activist. Lupe Ontiveros graduated from the Texas Woman's University. She worked for 15 years as a social worker in Los Angeles giving support to women and to education.

As actress, Ontiveros has participate in films like Selena y El norte, by Gregory Nava; Las mujeres de verdad tienen curvas, by Patricia Cardosa; Cachitos picantes, by Alfonso Arau; and The brave, directed by Johnny Deep. In television, she was recognized internationally for her contribution in the prime time soap opera series Desesperate Housewives; she also acted in the series Duddley and Veronica's closet.

Ontiveros was a founding member of the Latino Theatre Company in Los Angeles and is committed in fighting prejudices against the Latinos inside the American film industry.

MARCELO PIÑEYRO. Director, screenwriter. Argentina

He did cinema studies in the Facultad de Bellas Artes of La Plata. In 1980, he associated with Luís Puenzo in Cinemanía, an advertising film producing enterprise which became in a short time one of the leading companies in Latin America. In 1984, he was the executive producer of *La historia oficial*, directed by Luís Puenzo and winner of an Oscar Award for best foreign language film.

As director and screenwriter, Marcelo Piñeyro has filmed *Tango Feroz* (1993), *Caballos salvajes* (1995), *Cenizas del Paraíso* (1997), *Plata quemada* (2000), *Kamchatka* (2002), and *El método* (2006).

MOCTEZUMA ESPARZA. Producer. USA

Born in Los Angeles, California, in 1949, Esparza is one of the most important Latin producers and businessmen. He is recognized because of his contributions to the film industry and his commitment to foster opportunities for Latins within the enterteinment field.

Esparza is producer of *Selena*, by Gregory Nava (1997), and partner of the successful producing venture Esparza-Katz. He has worked with stars like Robert Redford, Jennifer Lopez, Andy Garcia, Jimmy Smits, Martin Sheen, Robert Duvall, and Halle Berry. Esparza founded recently Maya Entertainment Group. It is the only production, distribution, and exhibition enterprise whose owners and managers are Latinos within of the United States.

MEINOLF ZURHORST. Producter, director, writer. Germany

He studied art history and worked as a film and television critic. He is the author of 20 film books. In the 80's, he co-founded a company which produced programs for the German television. At the end of the same decade, he co-founded another film and post-production enterprise. Zurhorst is a director and screenwriter of numerous documentaries; the most famous of them is about two German film stars: Götz George and Mario Adorf.

Since 1992, he was the commissioning editor in cinema department of ARTE in Strasbourg, and four years later he was appointed head of the department. In 2000, he moved to the German TV ZDF which is shareholder of ARTE.

SANDRA DEN HAMER. Director IFFR. HollandShe studied Film and Theatre Sciencies at the University of Utrecht before joining Channel 4 in England as a trainee in 1984. She began her association with the International Film Festival Rotterdam (IFFR) in 1986, working as CineMart coordinator and festival producer, before becoming its deputy director in 1991. Since July 2000, Sandra co-directed the IFFR with Simon Field and was appointed as sole director of the Festival in March 2004.

Den Hamer has actively participated in numerous international panels, and production seminars and worshops over the last 20 years. She has served on the Dutch Film Fund's advisory committee and as a board member of FINE (Film Investors Netherlands). In September 2000, she was appointed director of the Filmmuseum of Amsterdam

IBERO-AMERICAN DOCUMENTARY FILM

EVERARDO GONZÁLEZ. Director. Mexico

He graduated from the Centro de Capacitación Cinematográfica and the Universidad Autónoma Metropolitana (UAM). In 2003, he directed the documentary *La canción del pulque*, which was awarded the Ariel for best Mexican documentary film and a special mention at the Morelia International Film Festival.

In 2007, his documentary *Los ladrones viejos. Las leyendas del artegio* received the best Mexican documentary film award and a special mention from the jury of the best Ibero-American documentary at the XXII Guadalajara International Film Festival. This documentary also obtained the José Rovirosa award granted by

the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM) and a special mention for the best Latin America documentary at the XVI Biarritz Festival in France.

PATRICIA BOERO. Executive manager LPB. Uruguay

Executive manager of Latino Public Broadcasting (LPB), a non-profit organization founded by the actor and director Edward James Olmos in 1998. Boero was director of the International Program of the Sundance Institute (1997-2001).

She studied cinema, theatre, law, and literature at the University of the New South Wales, Australia. She worked in SBS-TV, multi-cultural public television of Australia, and in Film Australia as director of documentaries. From 1985 to 1990, she lived in La Havana, Cuba and worked for Televisión Latina, the radio BBC and CNN filming documentaries in Uruguay, Nicaragua, El Salvador, and Cuba. In 1991, she moved to New York where worked for the Rockefeller Foundation and created a cinema and video scholarship program for Latin America. She worked for the MacArthur Foundation (1992-1997) in Chicago and was a board member of the documentary series P.O.V. of American Documentary Inc. and of INPUT (International Public Television Conference).

ADOLFO GARCÍA VIDELA. Filmmaker, journalist. Argentina

He began to work in the independent theatre in 1947, in journalism in 1949, and in cinema in 1950. He majored in documentaries and audiovisuals and has worked as filmmaker, planner, screenwriter, producer, and professor in cultural activities of promotion, broadcasting, education, research, and creativity. In Argentina he has worked for *La Nación, El Hogar, Mundo Argentino, Panorama,* and *Primera Plana,* and in Germany for *Die Welt* and in Mexico, where he lived since 1974, for *Excelsior*.

In 1976, he was coordinator of Audio-visual Media of the Consejo Nacional de Cultura in Mexico, and author, screenwriter, and filmmaker of the film library of the UNAM and TV-UNAM. He has been director of Latin American and European productions.

MEXICAN DOCUMENTARY FILM

CARMEN ARISTEGUI. Journalist. Mexico

Graduated in Communication Sciences at the Facultad de Ciencias Políticas of the UNAM, Aristegui is a reference within Mexican journalism. News anchor, political commentator, and interviewer in radio and television programs. She was an electoral council in Mexico City in 1997.

Aristegui was honored with the Premio Nacional de Periodismo (National Journalism Award), for the category of radio chronicle in 2001, and in 2004 for roundtable analysis. In 2006, her program *Hoy por Hoy* obtained the Premio Ondas Iberoamericano de Radio. She directs and chairs the interview program with her name in the international channel CNN in Spanish and collaborates with the journal *Reforma*.

JORGE DENTI. Director. Argentina

Born in San Martín, Argentina, in 1943. Director and film and television producer, Denti has lived in Mexico for the past 30 years. He was part of the group Cine de la Base with which he went in exile. In Peru, they filmed *Las AAA* son las tres armas (1977). Denti worked in Televisión de la Suiza Italiana, RAI, Channel Four of London, channel 40 of Mexico, among others. He has directed several documentaries like: *País verde y herido*, *Las 4 estaciones de Eliseo Diego*, and *Trece años y un día*.

LUÍS RENESES. Producer. Spain

He has worked in the film production since the 60's. Reneses has filled a number of positions in Televisión Española: executive producer for Latin American Co-productions; director of Financed Productions, and representative of Film Productions. Currently, he is a member of the Experts Committe of ICAA; advisor of Desarrollo de Proyectos de Casa de América; and jury of Ayudas a la Creación de Guiones of ICAA.

He has received the award Europa as producer of *Las gallinas de Cervantes* in 1987, and the Antena de Oro for his work, in 1988. Reneses has been jury in a number of festivals and speaker in different Latin America and Spanish forums. He has taught screenplay and production workshops in the ECAM of Madrid, the EICTV of Cuba, and in the Burgos and International of Andalucía universities.

SHORT FILMS JURY

KENYA MÁRQUEZ-ALKADEF. Director. Mexico

She did her undergraduate studies in Science and Techniques of Communication at the Universidad del Valle de Atemajac (UNIVA 1990-1993) and did studies in film screenplay at the Centro de Capacitación Cinematográfica (CCC 1998-2006). Her career in mass-media production includes radio and press experiences. She directed the short films *Cruz* (1997, best *opera prima* at the Mexico City International Short Film Festival in 1998 and nominated for an Ariel Award in 1999 for best fiction short film) and *La mesa*

servida (2000, best short film at the New York International Festival). After directing the Guadalajara International Film Festival (2002-2005), she returned to her filmmaking career with the short *Señas particulares* in 2006 (award of the Academia Jalisciense de Cinematografía at the XXII Guadalajara International Film Festival [2007]; best actress at the Festival Expresión en Corto and the International Short Film Festival [2007]; best Mexican short film in La Palmita EFM [2007]; and candidate to the Ariel Award 2008 for best fiction short film).

Márquez-Alkadef has taught in the UNIVA, University of Guadalajara (UDG), and the Instituto Tecnológico de Estudios Superiores de Occidente (ITESO). Currently, she works in the Centro de Arte, Arquitectura y Diseño (CUAAD-UDG), and is preparing her first fiction feature film *Fecha de caducidad*. The screenplay was awarded at the Gothenburg, Sweden, International Festival and is developing a documentary project about the filmmaker Cándida Beltrán Rendón.

ALEXANDER SALAS. General Manager of Cinemax Networks. Venezuela He has 19 years of broadcasting experience in operation management areas, programs and news for Latin America. He started to work in July 1988 as part of the production staff of HIT TV in Miami, Florida. Salas did studies in Radio & TV Broadcasting Technology at the Miami Dade Community College and in Broadcasting Productions at the Florida International University. He has worked in several Venezuelan television studios. Since July 1999, he works in HBO Latin America Group as a General Manager.

CARLOS SAMA. Director. Mexico

He studies Cinema at the CCC and musical composition at the CIEM. In 2002, Sama founded Catatonia Films. He has been honored in more than 40 advertising international festivals. His short film *La cola entre las patas* obtained the best Mexican short film award at the Guadalajara International Film Festival and the Audience Award for best short film at the Morelia International Film Festival, both in 2005. His first feature film, *Sin ton ni Sonia*, was screened in 2002 and, currently, he is writing his second screenplay.

TVE JURY

ELISEO ALBERTO ARROYO NARANJO. Cuba

Undergraduate in Journalism at the University of La Havana. He was an editor-in-chief of the literary gazette *El Caimán Barbudo* and assistant director of the

magazine Cine Cubano. He has published the poetry books Las cosas que yo amo and Un instante cada cosa; the youth novel La fogata roja (Premio Nacional de Crítica/Critic's National Award, 1983); a controversy advance of his memories Informe contra mí mismo; the novels La eternidad por fin comienza un lunes, Caracol Beach (Primer Premio Internacional de Novela Alfaguara/First International Award of Alfagaura Novel, 1998); and La fábula de José. He is a screenwriter (Guantanamera, Cartas del parque, El elefante y la bicicleta, Mascaró) and has taught classes and worshops at the Escuela Internacional de Cine de San Antonio de los Baños, Cuba, the Centro de Capacitación Cinematográfica de México, and the Sundance Institute.

HUGO VILLA. Producer. Mexico

He began working in the film industry at the age of twelve in dubbing voice, and has been involved in the production of several projects that include documentaries, fiction feature films, industry and educational documentaries. In 2000, Villa founded Hartos Indios, an enterprise with which he produced and photographed the documentary *Atrás de las sombras*, directed by Ozcar Ramírez, and produced the film *Club Eutanasia*, directed by Agustín "Oso" Tapia.

Villa has worked as a unit production manager in films such as *High Crimes* (2002) for 20th Century Fox and *In the Time of the Butterflies* (2001) for Showtime networks; *Man on fire* (2003) for Paramount; *Troy* (2003) for Warner Bros., and *The Legend of Zorro* (2004) for Sony pictures. Since February 2005, he has worked in the Instituto Mexicano de Cinematografía (IMCINE), as assistant director to support the film production and, since July 2007, he is in charge of the Dirección de Apoyo a la Producción Cinematográfica.

JAIME BOIX MARTÍNEZ. TVE Producer. Spain

He was born in Madrid in 1955. He has an undergraduate in Information Science with a major in Image. Boix Martínez began his career at TVE in 1984 where he worked in series, programs, and feature films. In 1987, he was appointed production delegate of the Dirección de Producción Externa and, recently, of Producciones Cinematográficas. He was assistant director of the Dirección de Adquisición de Derechos de Antena of TVE and director of this office until March 2008, when he left TVE. He has been jury in the Mostra de Cine Latinoamericano of Lleida; in the Films in Progress section of the San Sebastian Festival; in the documentaries section of the Huelva Festival and in the original screenplays section in the La Havana Festival.

General Secretary of the International Federation of Film Critics since 1987, Eder is a reference among German film critics. He started his career in the 60's and has written a number of essays and books. Eder has made in depth analyses about films by Andrzej Wadha, Luis Buñuel, and Nagisha Oshima.

ANNEMARIE MEIER BOZZA. Switzerland

She has degrees in Literature and Language Teaching from Swiss and Mexican universities.
